Entry requirements

- A standard equivalent to a GCSE grade 4 in English, mathematics and science.
- A 2.2 degree as minimum and normally a 2.1 degree or above for the salaried teaching apprenticeship routes
- A Grade B or above at A level for the maths specialism
- It is desirable but not essential to have 10 days recent UK primary school experience
- Pass functional skills tests in numeracy and literacy.
 Trainees sit functional skills tests in English and maths with bksb: www.bksb.co.uk
- Complete a fit for post health check
- Complete all the LETTA safeguarding requirements, including an Enhanced DBS
- If you are shortlisted, information will be sent to you about the interview process.
- You will be asked to bring photo ID a passport or photo driving license
- Evidence of immigration status
- LETTA and Sheffield Hallam University will accept GCSE equivalency tests in English, mathematics and science from www.equivalencytesting.co.uk or www.astarteachers.co.uk

The Selection Process: An Overview

The figure below is a diagrammatic representation of the process.

Do I need a school to apply?

A Degree: 2:2 or above

Work Experience: No minimum or maximum

School Experience: Desirable to have a minimum of 10 days but not essential

GCSEs or equivalent: Grade 4 or above in:
English, mathematics and science

A Level for maths specialism: Grade B or above

Do I apply for a salaried apprenticeship or an unsalaried place?

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Salaried Apprenticeship

A Degree: Normally a 2:1

Work Experience: 3 years or more

School Experience: Desirable to have a minimum of 10 days but not essential

GCSEs or equivalent: Grade 4 or above in: English, mathematics and science

> A Level for maths specialism: Grade B or above

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I have an overseas degree and qualifications

You need a ENIC statement for your degree and school certificates. Your degree will be assessed for equivalency to a British Honours degree.

Un/conditional Offer

Conditional offers will have entry criteria to meet.

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All offers conditional upon:

- Satisfactory references (seen at shortlisting)
- Satisfactory safeguarding checks include having an enhanced DBS
- Satisfactory 'fit for post' health check
- Sight of original certificates
- Proof of address, photo ID
- Degree, at appropriate classification
- A standard equivalent to a GCSE grade 4 in English, mathematics and science
- Securing a school with the capacity to train, including an outstanding class teacher / mentor
 - Evidence of satisfactory literacy skills via a LETTA written task at interview
 - Pass in functional skills tests
 - Evidence of immigration status

NOTE: All schools must be deemed suitable for training by LETTA. An advisory visit may be needed. Potential new partner schools are always visited. Mentors need to apply to LETTA for the role, with head teacher commendations.

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

The Team

Who will be supporting you on your learning journey?

You will be supported by:

- outstanding teachers
- a school-based mentor who will work alongside you as the class teacher
- LETTA tutors who you will see regularly throughout the year
- academic tutors from the University, to help you with your PGCE

Everyone will be committed to your development as a high-quality reflective practitioner.

LETTA Training

What to expect during your training year on this course.

You will attain Qualified Teacher Status and a PGCE qualification, which is worth a third of a Masters degree.

On the LETTA weekly programme, you will benefit from innovative sessions which will be informed by research and theory and linked to your classroom practice.

These training sessions are led by experienced trainers, professional tutors and well known educationalists like Bill Rogers, Professor Barry Hymer, Shirley Clarke, Pie Corbett and Daisy Christodoulou.

The training covers all areas of the primary curriculum appropriate to your course. There will be additional emphasis on national priorities such as reading, phonics, maths, special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and behaviour management.

Information regarding the primary course with maths or SEND specialisms, can be obtained from the LETTA administrator. PGCE assignments must have a maths or SEND focus and there will be a variety of personalised activities with an emphasis on maths or SEND, depending on the specialism.

The programme is carefully constructed by LETTA and the schools involved and builds upon excellent practice already established within the partnership.

During your training year you will teach in a minimum of three settings. Your placements will be:

- Your main class
- Another age phase, usually in the same school, for four weeks
- Another school, for five weeks
- Another class, for one week. This is the collaborative creativity placement where trainees teach collaboratively in small teams.

For salaried apprenticeship routes

If you are on the salaried apprenticeship route you will be paid a salary by your host school at point 1 of the unqualified teachers pay scale. There will be an additional cost of £1,600 for the PGCE, paid in instalments during the year. Further advice is available from the LETTA Business Manager.

For unsalaried routes

Tuition fees are £9,250. You can access the tuition fees and maintenance loans from the Student Loans Company. www.slc.co.uk

You can pay all or part of the tuition fees yourself, if you prefer.

Many partner schools will offer an untaxed bursary to support unsalaried trainees. This is discretionary.


