



Early Career Teacher Induction Programme

Our programme supports ECTs to meet the requirements of their induction period through personalised learning and professional guidance. ECTs will be supported by a dedicated team of staff, a learning community and a range of educational experts. The programme is rooted in the principles of community, collaboration, research and reflection. In September ECTs will undertake a two year Induction period and will engage in a mix of face-to-face learning, remote learning and school-based learning. Collaborating with the East London Teaching School hub and UCL, ECTs will have opportunities to further network and develop their skills

Specialist Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics Programme for Early Career Teachers

This project is designed to support early career teachers in developing specialist knowledge for teaching mathematics, thus enabling them to understand, teach and support pupils in maths in the classroom.

Participants and their schools will:

- Enhance their maths subject knowledge with an emphasis on the key structures in each mathematical area covered
- Understand the key elements that form number sense, forms of addition and subtraction, forms of multiplication and division and forms of fractions, including precise language, structures and representations
- Review their practice as a result of the sessions and make specific adaptations to impact on pupil outcomes.

Specialist Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics Programme for Teaching Assistants (KS1 & KS2)

This project is designed to support teaching assistants in developing specialist knowledge for teaching mathematics, thus enabling them to understand, teach and support pupils in maths in the classroom. Participants will enhance their maths subject knowledge with an emphasis on the key structures in each mathematical area covered.

The programme is based on four core primary modules:

- Number sense
- Additive reasoning
- Multiplicative reasoning
- Fractions

This course is planned for socially distanced face-to-face delivery and numbers will be limited. An alternative delivery method may be used following updates to government advice.

Paediatric First Aid

Level 3 Ofgual Regulated 2 day course

Upon completion of day 1, you will be able to:

- Understand the role and responsibilities of the paediatric First Aider
- Assess an emergency situation safely
- Provide First Aid to an infant/child who is unresponsive and breathing normally
- Provide First Aid to an infant/child who is unresponsive and not breathing normally
- Provide First Aid to infant/child who has a foreign body airway obstruction
- Provide First Aid to an infant/child with external bleeding
- Understand how to provide First Aid to an infant/child who is suffering from shock
- Understand how to provide First Aid to an infant/child with anaphylaxis

The second part of the qualification will give you the ability to:

- Administer First Aid to an infant/child with injuries to bones, joints and muscles
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child with head and spinal injuries
- Understand how to administer First Aid to an infant/child with conditions affecting the eyes, ears and nose
- Administer emergency First Aid to an infant/child with a chronic medical condition or sudden illness
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child who is experiencing the effects of extreme heat or cold
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child who has sustained an electric shock
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child with burns or scalds
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child who has been poisoned
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child who has been bitten or stung
- Administer First Aid to an infant/child with minor injuries
- Complete records relating to illnesses, injuries and emergencies
