A leadership development programme for new and developing school leaders across all roles and departments. Lead London is aligned to the Team Leader or Supervisor Level 3 qualification.

Why is this course for you?

Leaders in schools fill many roles. This programme is designed for all aspiring and developing school leaders, regardless of their role. This might include subject leaders, middle leaders, SENCOs, office managers, premises managers, operations teams—and a wide range of other roles too. There is plenty to learn about leadership from both within and outside of the education sector, and facilitators are drawn from a wide range of occupational backgrounds.

What qualification will you gain?

Participants on this programme will gain a Team Leader or Supervisor Level 3 apprenticeship qualification and Foundation Chartered Manager accreditation (fCMgr).

What will you study?

Participants on this programme will undertake four leadership modules covering a range of knowledge, skills and behaviours essential for successful leadership - this includes leading and managing people, building relationships, effective communication, operational and project management, strategic management, financial awareness, personal effectiveness and leading with integrity. Participants will have regular engagement with a personal tutor, including opportunities for professional coaching. In addition to academic support, learners have access to mental health and wellbeing support services including counselling and financial guidance. We ask employers to support participants by providing a workplace mentor and advocate.

Teaching, learning and assessment

This is a 12 month qualification followed by an assessment period. Teaching includes face-to-face conference days, remote tutorials, work-based learning activities and online learning. In addition you will be supported by a work-based mentor and tutors. Progress is measured through a virtual leadership portfolio consisting of assignments, evidence of professional competence in work-based situations, and observations that demonstrate application of the knowledge and skills gained. There are no written exams.

End Point Assessment (EPA) and professional recognition

Participants will undertake an End Point Assessment (EPA). This will consist of a presentation with questioning, followed by a professional discussion underpinned by a portfolio of evidence. Upon successful completion of the EPA, participants will be awarded a Team Leader or Supervisor Level 3 qualification and will be awarded Foundation Chartered Manager status with post-nominals fCMgr.

English and maths requirements

Participants without level 2 English and maths will have the opportunity to achieve these qualifications prior to taking the End Point Assessment. An exemption may be considered in agreement with the learner's employer.

Entry requirements

- Completion of an entry assessment and achieved a pass in English and maths initial assessments
- Employed in a job role in which day-to-day responsibilities support achievement of the qualification.

Funding eligibility

- Aged 16+ at the time of enrolment
- A citizen of the UK or EEA, or has lived in the UK or EEA for the past three consecutive years
- Employed full time, working a minimum of 30 hours per week (flexibility for part time working will be considered; please get in touch)
- A participant may be ineligible for funding if they hold a higher level qualification in the same area of study. LETTA can advise candidates as to eligibility.
